Churchill's (邱吉爾) wise sayings

Good morning, teachers and students. Today, I'd like to share with you some of the wise sayings of Winston Churchill. Winston Churchill was the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom from 1940 to 1945 and again from 1951 to 1955. During his time as Prime Minister, Churchill led Britain to victory in the Second World War.

On becoming prime minister, Churchill mobilized the English language and made it fight. In fact, Churchill won the Nobel Prize in Literature by his famous book "The Second World War". Similarly, boys and girls, never give in. Never give in to difficulties. Never give in to frustrations. Never give in to trouble. Never surrender.

On facing the attack of Hitler and Germany, Churchill also said the following encouraging words:

"Do not let us speak of darker days: let us speak rather of sterner days. These are not dark days; these are great days--the greatest days our country has ever lived; and we must all thank God that we have been allowed to play a part in making these days memorable in the history

of our race.”

Similarly, boys and girls, difficult days are not dark days. Difficult days are in fact great days. These great days build up our character. These great days build up our strength. We should thank God for giving us such opportunities to grow up. So, boys and girls, never give in. Never give up. Never surrender.

On other occasions, Churchill also said the following wise words:

“Success is not final, failure is not fatal, it is the courage to continue that counts.” “A pessimist sees the difficulty in every opportunity; an optimist sees the opportunity in every difficulty.”

In other words, when you are successful, do not be too proud of it. When you fail, do not be disappointed because it does not cause death. The most important point is to continue with courage. Besides, be optimistic and not pessimistic. There is an opportunity in every difficulty. There is a solution to every problem. There is hope in every frustration.

In conclusion, when Churchill and the British people faced the German attack and the most difficult situation during the Second World War, the British people never gave in, never gave up, never surrendered. Similarly, let us follow their good model and never give up when we are encountering difficulties.
